

Kentucky requires a minimum of 30 continuing hours over a two year period with at least two of those hours related to Ethics.

AL requires 12 hours per year. We have two categories of CEUs: content 1 and content 2. Content 1 is anything that directly relates to practice/therapy. Content 2 are hours that support you in your work- state department of education updates, for example. We can only have a maximum of two content 2 hours, but no content 2 hours are required. One hour of ethics training is strongly recommended.

All hours must be approved by out state licensing board prior to the CE event. All ASHA approved hours are approved by the state board.

Minnesota has 2 licenses -

1) for Department of Health SLPs and Audiologists must complete 30 hours of continuing education directly related to the field of Communication and Hearing Disorders every 2 years for relicense.

2) for Department of Education - SLPs can verify they have the current ASHA CCC and then not do the required 125 clock hours through their local school district or other continuing education every 5 years for relicense. Plus then only need to complete 1 hour of continuing education (as required for all teaching licenses) in each of 5 specialty areas (i.e. CCC + 5 hours CE).

Vermont

Here's a relevant excerpt from our Agency of Education's website:<http://education.vermont.gov/licensing/become-an-educator/speech-language>

All Educational SLP licenses (6-84) are currently at Level I. To renew educators are required to have a minimum of 35 hours of new professional learning with at least 5 hours of new learning that applies directly to the knowledge and performance standards of the endorsement. The 30 hours of professional learning required by the Office of Professional Regulation to renew the clinical license can account for the remaining required hours. Educators that have worked under the 6-84 endorsement for three or more years in a Vermont school must transition to a Level II license.

Vermont Speech-Language Hearing Association (VSHA)

Vermont requires the same as ASHA, 30 credits every 3 years. New Hampshire requires 30 credits every 2 years.

Arkansas

Continuing Education

Continuing Professional Education (CPE)

Arkansas requires 10 hours of continuing professional education each year.

shall consist of a series of planned learning experiences beyond the educational programs that have led to the degree that qualifies one for licensure. The licensee must participate in CPE activities of at least **ten (10) clock hours** for each license period (July 1 through June 30 of each year). At least five (5) of these hours must be in Content Area I. Dual licensees must complete **fifteen (15) clock hours** with a minimum of five **(5) hours in each discipline** from Content Area I. Renewal of a license shall be contingent upon the licensee fulfilling the CPE requirements, submitting an annual CPE report, and maintaining evidence for possible audit.

Provisional and full licensees are not required to complete a report of continuing professional education and will not be audited *during the initial licensing year*, but will need to submit the report to document a minimum of ten (10) hours for the next licensing period (7/1 to 6/30). There is **no** exemption for the year in which the provisional license is converted to a full license unless it occurs in the initial licensing year.

OHIO #2

Dear Dr. Lenkey,

One of our licensees, and a former chairperson of our Ohio licensure board forwarded your e-mail seeking information about the continuing education requirements to share with Michigan. Ohio requires 20 hours of continuing education for speech-language pathologists and audiologists in Ohio every two years. At least two of the twenty hours must be related to ethics. Ten of the twenty hours must be specific to the clinical practice in the area of the person's license, and ten hours may be related to speech-language pathology, audiology, or both. Licensees who renew their license for the very first time are exempt from the continuing education requirements.

Continuing education activity: Licensees in Ohio may complete their continuing education by completing a number of different activities. Acceptable activities include course work/classes from accredited universities or colleges, seminars, conferences, lectures, in-service professional development, etc. Activities automatically meet our continuing education requirements if approved by the American Speech-Language Hearing Association, American Academy of Audiology, or another state agency in Ohio or another state. Licensees may also submit request to the licensure board for approval of continuing education activity.

Documentation of continuing education activity: The Board requires documentation to demonstrate completion of continuing education activities. Documentation must be written verification of the provider's name, course/activity title, date of activity, number of hours earned, and the licensee's name. This is typically demonstrated with a certificate of attendance. Licensees are required to keep documentation of their continuing education for a period of four years after the date of the last renewal period, in case the board audits the licensee's continuing education hours.

Continuing Education Audit: The Board is authorized to audit any licensee's continuing education hours. Our continuing education rules also allow for a random audit selection process in which 10 percent of licensed SLPs and AUDs are randomly selected for audit. Licensees who are randomly selected are notified and must submit proof of their continuing education hours by a specified date. The Board does not require licensees to submit proof of the continuing education hours at the time they renew their license; documentation is required if they are randomly selected for an audit.

The Board utilizes CE Broker, a continuing education tracking system to track continuing education. CE Broker is voluntary in Ohio. Licensees who report 20 hours of continuing education to their transcript in CE Broker are exempt from a CE audit.

The Board grants requests for waivers of the continuing education hours or extensions for extenuating circumstances such as medical reasons or military service.

Oklahoma Licensure Board requires 20 hour in a 2 year period

This is straight from our licensure regulations in the state of Oklahoma.

A minimum of twenty (20) clock hours of acceptable continuing education will be required for renewal of a license to practice speech-language pathology or audiology in a two year period. The continuing education period begins in January of every odd-numbered year. A speech-language pathologist or audiologist obtaining initial licensure during a two year period shall have his or her continuing education requirement prorated to 2.5 clock hours per full quarter remaining in that period

Exceptions to the requirements.

Exceptions to the pre-approval requirement may be granted at the discretion of the Board for programs presented by recognized sponsors whose programs have been pre-approved by the Board. The university academic semester hour is equivalent to fifteen (15) clock hours, and shall be verified by the presentation of an official academic transcript showing course or audit credits. The licensee is ultimately responsible for providing all information necessary for the Board to make a final determination concerning the acceptability of any requested continuing education hours.

In addition, the licensure board just passed beginning this year that 3 hours be in the area of Ethics and 3 hours in the area of supervision if you are supervising a CFY.

Illinois

“provide proof of completing at least 20 clock hours of continuing education during the 2-year licensing cycle for which he or she is currently licensed. An audiologist who has met the continuing education requirements of the Hearing Instrument Consumer Protection Act during an equivalent licensing cycle under this Act shall be deemed to have met the continuing education requirements of this Act. At a minimum, the rules shall require a renewal applicant for licensure as a speech language pathology assistant to provide proof of completing at least 10 clock hours of continuing education during the 2-year period for which he or she currently holds a license.”

California requires 12 hours per year.

Texas has licensure renewable every 2 years with 10 hours per year of continuing ed credit...and, 2 hours every 2 years of ethics continuing ed (included in the 10 hours per year requirement)

Montana has 40 renewal credits every odd year.

Mississippi - The SLP teaching certificate requires 5 CEU's every 5 years for masters level SLPS. These are not required to be ASHA approved CEUS; however, if the SLP is ASHA certified (which most school masters level SLPS are) they need to be ASHA approved. These CEUS can also include college classes.

Speech teachers with only a bachelors degree must earn 10 CEUS in 5 years. They are not required to be ASHA approved CEUS. These CEUS can also include college credit.

Any other employment position including private practice, hospitals, early intervention etc. requires a Department of Health certificate. One hold a masters degree to obtain this licensure. The SLP must earn 2 ASHA approved CEUS every 2 years.
